

The Season of Lent is upon us. The word Lent means Spring (thanks be to God). It is a time of spiritual growth. Decide what you will do to grow closer to the Lord during this time of Grace. When you come forward to receive the Blessed Ashes on Wednesday, let that be a sign of your commitment to whatever it is that you decided to do (or not do).

Some ideas:

- -Go to a weekday Mass during the five weeks of Lent.
- -Celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- -Stations of the Cross each Friday during Lent.
- -Visit the Blessed Sacrament on a Tues., Wed. or Thurs. during the day each week.

-Most especially, plan to attend the Easter Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday.

Lenten Days of Fast and Abstinence

In solidarity with the Universal Church, Catholics observe certain days of fast and abstinence, as a corporate sign of sacrifice in atonement for our sins, which caused the Lord to suffer and die for those sins and the sins of the whole world.

Of course, we can and should sacrifice in other way as well, but these actions show our collective sorrow.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

The Significance of Ashes

A Reflection by St. Pope John Paul II



The ashes imposed on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday are a reminder of our unworthiness and sinfulness-sinfulness that corrupts and stains us and leads to death (we return to the dust from whence we came). Ashes remind us of our original sin and our need of redemption - - of our need to be cleansed of sin and made worthy of Salvation. This is why the priest says, as he imposes ashes on our foreheads, "Remember, O Man, that you are dust and unto dust you shall return".

Use of Call Multiplier

You may recall getting a phone call from The Diocese of Harrisburg Bishop Reverend Timothy Senior with a short recorded message about Christmas last year.

This message helps keep you informed about the celebration and a welcome invitation to keep the holy days foremost in your preparation for the holidays.

The St Ignatius Loyola Parish has an interest to bring this capability to our parishioners to keep you informed about parish activities and to use in the case of immediate emergencies.

Call Multiplier is an automated phone call that contains a recorded message that will provide important information such as extreme weather conditions or emergency changes in Masses at the parish.

The pastor will use this system to reach out and ensure that safety is a priority. The capability will not be used as a regular way to keep in touch or to reiterate items that are already published in the weekly church bulletin that are now posted on the Parish website.

The Pastoral Council asks for your time to experiment with this system and get familiar with how it operates, especially if the call received is recognizable as from the St Ignatius Loyola Parish. Calls from this system will only come directly from the Parish phone number.




