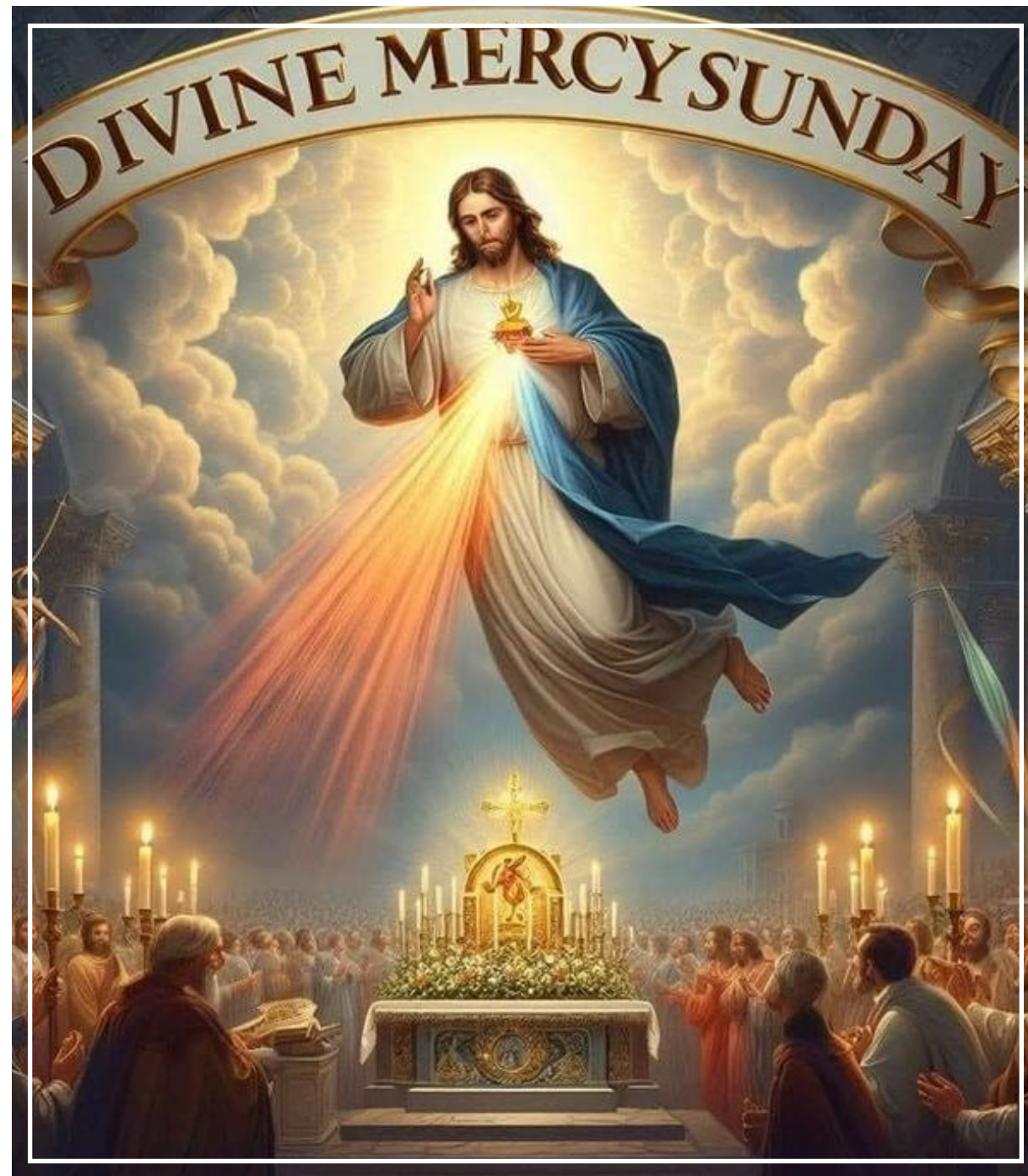

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today in the sure and certain hope that we have in the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, we join with the Universal Church in mourning the death of our Holy Father, Pope Francis. It is profoundly significant that the Holy Father died as the Church rejoices in the Easter Mystery. In this Jubilee Year, Pope Francis has encouraged us to have hope in all circumstances – the hope that will not disappoint. At the same time, the Holy Father’s passing leaves a void in the hearts of millions around the world who were touched by his unwavering faith, compassion and commitment to justice. As we continue our Easter observances, we are reminded that death is not the end, but a passage to everlasting life.

Pope Francis was a shepherd who led us with humility and grace. He reminded us constantly of the importance of mercy and the power of love in our daily lives. His words were not mere rhetoric; they were a call to action. Through his encyclicals, such as Laudato Si’, Pope Francis urged us to care for our common home and to be stewards of creation. He ignited a global movement to foster environmental justice, reminding us that the care of our planet is a moral obligation.

In his papacy, Pope Francis broke down barriers and reached out to those on the margins of society. One of the most significant aspects of his papacy was his focus on the marginalized and the forgotten. Upon his election in 2013 as Pope, he chose the name Francis, in honor of St. Francis of Assisi, as a reminder that the poor should never be forgotten and to express his desire to live simply and to be a catalyst for renewal in the Church. He consistently reminded us that the Church must be a place of welcome and inclusion. His heartfelt gestures, such as washing the feet of prisoners and visiting the sick, exemplified his belief in the dignity of every person. Pope Francis challenged us to look beyond our comfort zones and reach out to those who are suffering, urging us to be the hands and feet of Christ in the world. Even on his deathbed, until his strength gave out, every evening he spoke with the pastor and parishioners of The Church of the Holy Family in Gaza to inquire how they were doing and offer prayers and his blessing.

While we grieve the loss of Pope Francis, we celebrate the great impact he had on our lives and the world. His vision of a more compassionate and just society will continue to inspire us as we carry forward his mission. We can honor his memory best by living out the values he espoused: love, mercy, and a commitment to the common good, and, especially in this Jubilee Year 2025, to be “Pilgrims of Hope” together.

I ask that all parishes of the Diocese of Harrisburg pray for and offer a Mass for Pope Francis, and that all pray for the repose of his soul. May God grant Pope Francis eternal rest, a merciful judgment, and may we be empowered by his legacy to continue being witnesses of faith, hope, and love in our world.

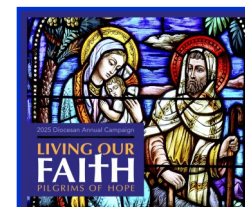

HOW TO PRAY

THE CHAPLET OF DIVINE MERCY

1. Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

2. Our Father

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, Amen.

3. Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen.

4. Apostle's Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

5. On each of the Large Beads

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

6. On each of the Small Beads

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

After Praying All 5 Decades

7. Concluding Doxology (Repeat 3x)

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

8. Closing Prayer (optional)

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion — inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.
